#### 2022-2023 Highlights

- Learner achievement is up 2% from last year, now at 94%.
- Learner retention and Pass Rates rose to 97% (up 1% on 2012-2022).
- Attendance rates have risen by 3% on the previous year to 88.5%.
- Although enrolments were down 9% on the previous year, learners enrolled onto more courses up 13% on the previous year overall, and up 4% on qualification courses and 22% on non-qualification courses.
- 52% of our learners are new learners.
- 75% of our learners have no previous qualifications. Of these learners, 56% gained a qualification in 2022-2023.
- 65% of our learners are not in employment.
- Benchmarked against 6 other London Borough providers in 2022-2023, The Adult College came first in learner Retention, Achievement and Attendance.
- 100% of learners benefit from high quality teaching up 3% on 2021/2022.
- 108 laptops loaned to learners, 90% of whom attained a qualification.
- 80.5% of learners are female and 19.5% are male.
- 98% of 70 SEND learners achieved their qualifications. 11% are also volunteering in the community.
- 99% of 281 learners surveyed said they felt safe at the College.
- 100% of staff rated training opportunities as good or excellent.
- Our Advisory Board Members support us with Learning Walks, the Celebration of Achievement awards, and Performance Review Board.




#### The Adult College of Barking and


