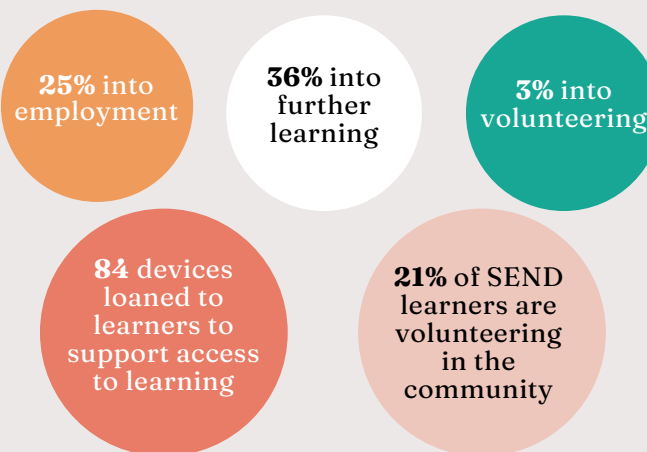
The Quality of education is good with outstanding elements:

96% of delivery identified as good or excellent

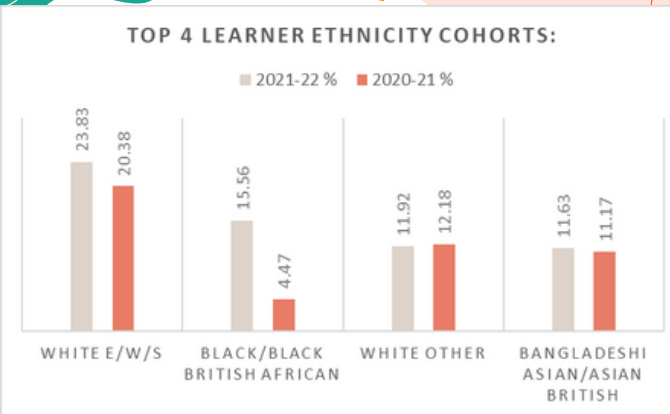
98% of learners benefit from high quality teaching

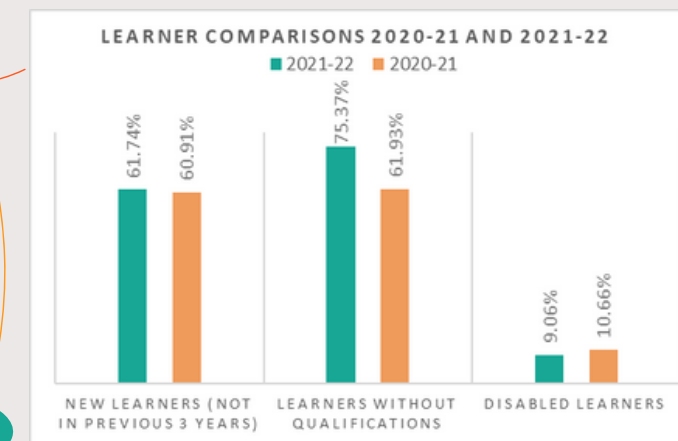
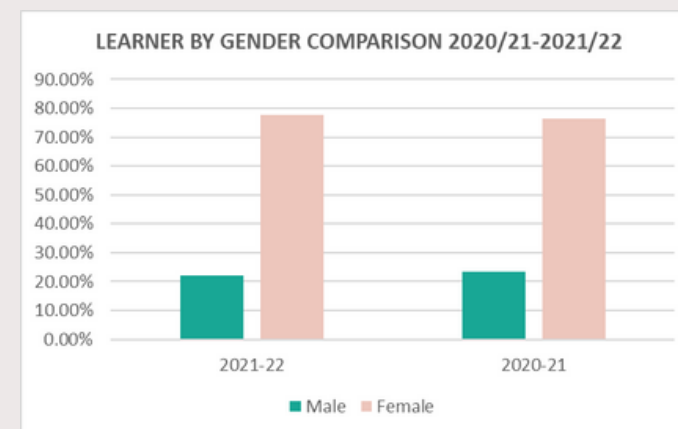

Service Achievements 2021-23

- Adult College Retention remains high at 96.7%
- Pass Rate increased in 21/22 to 95.8%

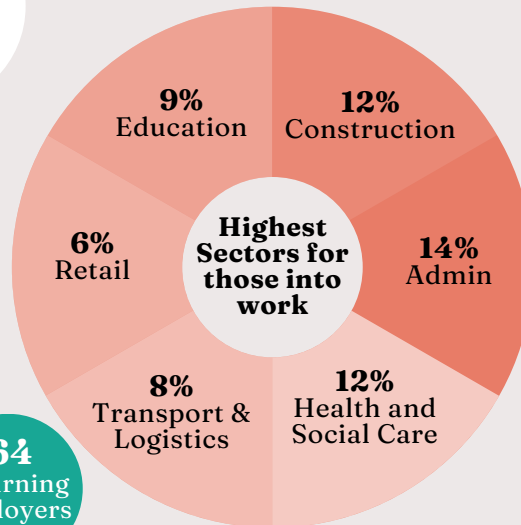
